Dear friends in Christ,

First, I want to thank everyone who participated in our "Unifying Worship Service" on September 28. It is always a joy to see people participate in worship leadership, and this special service was no exception.

Something else for which I am grateful in the past month is the opportunity to restart our weekly Bible study. No matter where I'm serving, I have always appreciated the opportunity to gather together to study God's Word. For me, Bible study is not about finding the right answers about a particular passage or topic. It is more about digging into God's Word together, listening to what God might be saying to us, either as individuals or as a church. The remarkable thing is that within any given group, there may be a variety of perspectives, some of which we may find challenging. This is a beautiful thing!

We live in a world that tends to value easy answers and either/or thinking. Which can sometimes make it difficult to study the Bible. I've ended many Bible studies saying, "No answers, just more questions." However, when we spend time wrestling with our questions, we may also find that we are drawn closer to God.

At the end of the gospel of Matthew, Jesus meets his disciples on a mountain to commission them. There is a curious detail in this passage: "When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted." (Matthew 28:17) There is room for doubts and questions in our faith. I believe God can handle them.

But then as Jesus sends his disciples out to baptize, teach, and make disciples, he assures them of this promise: "I am with you always to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)Whether you study the Bible individually or in a group, I hope that you will allow yourself to ask questions and even to be challenged. But most of all, I hope that you will find assurance of God's unconditional love for you and for all of God's creation.
